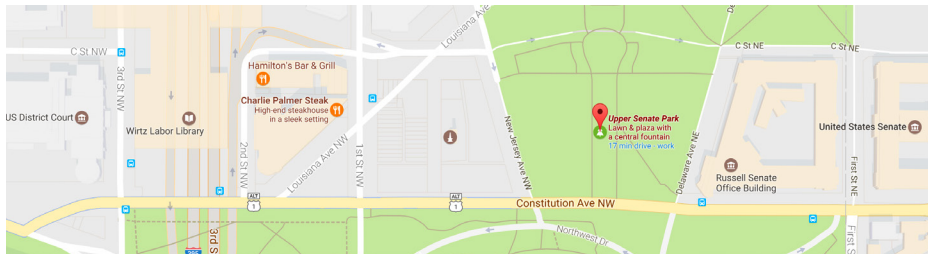
Event Detail

What to Expect

Not sure what to wear, how to get there or parking? Don't worry! Listed below are a few things you need to know that will help with any anxiety you may have regarding making your way to the U.S Capitol Grounds.

What to Wear

Please remember to be comfortable while supporting the cause and keep in mind any meetings on Capitol Hill that you may have later.

Please wear comfortable walking shoes; shoes that you believe will not strain your feet while standing and walking around. The Rally for Water will be held on the lawn.

Please dress weather appropriate. The end of March tends to have daytime high temperatures in the high 50s. but can get as low as the high 30s. We recommend dressing in layers and bringing a jacket in case the weather is cool.

Union Station- Located at 1st St, NE, and Massachusetts Ave, NE. (10 Minute Walk)

Capitol South – Located at 1st St between C and D SE. (14 Minute Walk)

Federal Center, SW – Located at SE 3rd St, SW and D St, SW. (15 Minute Walk)

What's Prohibited

Listed below are a few things that are prohibited while on U.S. Capitol Grounds:

Any firearm, explosive, club, missile, chemical or other incendiary device or other weapon.

It is also prohibited to use or display any open flame including, but not limited to, ignited candles, torches, lanterns, or lamps.

Federal law prohibits flying Unmanned Aircraft Systems, such as drones, anywhere in the District of Columbia. Washington, D.C. and the U.S. Capitol Grounds are designated as a NO DRONE ZONE.

Flashlights and other battery-powered lights are permitted.

The use of camera equipment to film or photograph on Capitol Grounds for private or other non-commercial use is permitted

The use of tripods or other film or photography enhancement equipment is limited to grassy areas where pedestrian or vehicular traffic will not be impeded.
