Make polluters pay, not communities! Support CERCLA liability protections for water systems to hold PFAS polluters accountable.

During Water Week 2024 we salute the water utility workforce – the foundation of essential public health and environmental protection!

\$50 billion is needed for drinking water utilities to install PFAS treatment technologies over the next 20 years.

Operational costs for individual clean water utilities will increase up to 60% as a direct result of new PFAS regulations.

Make permanent the Federal lowincome water assistance program – over 1.4 million households in need have been helped so far.

Up to 20% of American households struggle to pay unaffordable water service bills.

Invest in water research to keep our water safe, secure, and sustainable.

Federal water investment must continue to grow. EPA estimates \$750 billion is needed over 20 years just to maintain utility's current levels of service – but their costs are escalating.



For water utilities, agility is key. Support regulations that bend, not break, with the waves of innovation.

Improperly flushed wipes result in \$441 million per year in additional operating costs at US clean water utilities. Passing HR2964/S1350 will set federal labeling standards!

Water is the foundation of our economy. A one-day disruption in water service nationally would mean an aggregate daily loss of \$43.5 billion in sales and \$22.5 billion in GDP.

Congress must create a permanent low-income water customer assistance program to help utilities maintain aging infrastructure, while keeping services affordable for lowincome households.

The US water workforce supports 1.7 million jobs across 212 different occupations.
